**NATIONAL HEALTH SERVICE SELECTS ADB FOR ON-LINE
PROCUREMENT INITIATIVE
ADB solution to generate annual cost savings of £500,000**

LONDON, U.K. – April 3, 2003 – ADB Systems International (TSE: ADY, OTCBB: ADBI), a global provider of asset lifecycle management solutions, today announced that it will provide the Healthcare Purchasing Consortium (HPC), a group purchasing organization within the National Health Service (NHS), an electronic procurement and sourcing solution expected to generate annual savings of £500,000 through reduced purchasing costs and improved efficiencies.

ADB's procurement and sourcing solution will be used initially by six Trusts in Birmingham and London, from all of the NHS' areas of operations, to purchase healthcare consumables and medical equipment through a central on-line catalogue.

"Using ADB's technology, we will be able to connect multiple Trusts and their various financial and information systems to a single on-line catalogue, enabling the NHS clinical staff to reduce time spent on administrative tasks and focus on delivering quality healthcare services to our patients."

Using a common data structure, ADB's web-based solution will allow individual Trusts to take advantage of economies of scale previously unattainable with existing purchasing systems and practices, while ensuring that vendors comply with pre-determined contract terms and conditions. The web-based system will also enable Trusts to issue purchase orders electronically to approved suppliers, integrate to on-line marketplaces and facilitate payment processes.

"ADB continues to build momentum in a number of key industry verticals, such as healthcare, based on the strength of our technology and our proven ability to deliver flexible solutions that are tailored to our customers' needs," said Jeff Lymburner, CEO of ADB Systems. "We look forward to working with the NHS and ensuring that this procurement initiative delivers expected value."
